**Oral Questions, 30 minutes*

***Lord Berkeley** to ask Her Majesty's Government when they intend to update the cost estimate and business case for HS2 Phase One.

***Baroness Lister of Burtersett** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the implications for their proposed domestic abuse strategy of the default joint payment of universal credit to couples.

***Lord Lea of Crondall** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they made of the precedents for Parliament providing them with a mandate for international negotiations, including the effect of section 7 of the European Communities (Amendment) Act 1993 on the Maastricht Treaty negotiations, when deciding to oppose Lords amendment 20 to the European Union (Withdrawal) Bill; and whether they consider any such precedents conclusive in supporting the view that Parliament mandating them in negotiations is not consistent with the constitutional role of Parliament in relation to the conduct of international relations.

***Lord McKenzie of Luton** to ask Her Majesty's Government what progress they have made towards establishing an online pensions dashboard.

“70A Laying of documents under Schedule 7 to the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018

Where, under paragraphs 3(3) and 17(3) of Schedule 7 to the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018, any document is to be laid before Parliament, the deposit of a copy of the document with the Clerk of the Parliaments in accordance with this Order at any time during the existence of a Parliament when the House is not sitting for public business shall constitute the laying of it before the House.”
