5 **Social housing** A question was asked by Lord Shipley and answered by Lord Bourne of Aberystwyth.

6 **Student Loans Company** A question was asked by Lord Hunt of Kings Heath and answered by Viscount Younger of Leckie.

7 **Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament** The Lord Privy Seal moved that this House approves the nomination of Lord Janvrin and the Marquess of Lothian as members of the Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament. The motion was agreed to.

8 **Financial Guidance and Claims Bill [HL]** The bill was read a third time. Amendments 1 to 33 were agreed to and a privilege amendment was agreed to. Then the bill was passed and sent to the Commons.

9 **Sanctions and Anti-Money Laundering Bill [HL]** The bill was considered in Committee. Amendments were considered. The House resumed after clause 16 was agreed to.

The House adjourned at 9.08pm until Wednesday 22 November at 3.00pm.
