9 **Tenant Fees Bill** The bill was further considered in Committee, beginning with amendment 27. Amendments were considered. The House resumed and the bill was reported without amendment.

10 **Brexit: negotiations** (5 hour-debate) Lord Callanan moved that this House takes note of the statement by the Prime Minister repeated by the Lord Privy Seal on 15 November relating to the European Union exit negotiations. After debate, the motion was agreed to.
