\***Lord Storey** to ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to develop mental health support in schools.

\***Baroness Pinnock** to ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to ensure that the planned local government fair funding allocation will provide local authorities with the resources needed to provide sufficient and effective local services.

†\***The Lord Bishop of St Albans** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the sufficiency of current industry contributions to efforts to reduce gambling-related harm.

**European Union (Definition of Treaties) (Economic Partnership Agreements and Trade Agreement) (Eastern and Southern Africa States, Southern African Development Community States, Ghana and Ecuador) Order 2018** Baroness Fairhead to move that the draft Order laid before the House on 19 July be approved. *(Dinner break business)*

**Lord Stevenson of Balmacara** to move, as an amendment to the above motion, at end to insert "but that this House regrets that the draft Order does not appear to take into account the substantive issues raised to date about the impacts on local agriculture, industry and commerce, and the well-being of the wider population in the partner states to each agreement; expresses serious concern at the fundamental lack of accountability and parliamentary scrutiny available at present for treaties and trade agreements; and calls on Her Majesty's Government to come forward as soon as reasonably practicable with a series of proposals on how trade policy is to be determined after the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union."
