***Baroness Wheeler** to ask Her Majesty's Government how they will ensure that there are sufficient nurses, doctors and community specialist care staff to deliver the National Health Service long-term plan, published on 7 January 2019.

***Baroness Bloomfield of Hinton Waldrist** to ask Her Majesty's Government what the impact will be on the coastguard of the RNLI's decision to downgrade the all-weather lifeboats capacity in New Quay, Ceredigion.

***Baroness Benjamin** to ask Her Majesty's Government whether they intend to introduce legislation to ensure that public sector content continues to be easily discoverable by viewers, regardless of how they are accessing broadcasting content.
