\***Lord Greaves** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the levels of council tax in England that have been announced for 2019–20. [I]

\***Baroness Thornhill** to ask Her Majesty's Government what progress they have made towards the completion of the fair funding review to set new baseline funding allocations for local authorities on the basis of relative needs and resources.

\***Lord Clement-Jones** to ask Her Majesty's Government what consideration they have given to the standards and certifications required for the algorithms used in decision-taking by public authorities and agencies.

\***Baroness Wheatcroft** to ask Her Majesty's Government how many companies have signed non-disclosure agreements with them in relation to preparations for the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union.

**Business of the House** The Lord Privy Seal (Baroness Evans of Bowes Park) to move that Standing Order 46 (*No two stages of a Bill to be taken on one day*) be dispensed with on Tuesday 19 March to allow the Northern Ireland (Regional Rates and Energy) (No. 2) Bill to be taken through its remaining stages that day.

**Northern Ireland (Regional Rates and Energy) (No. 2) Bill** The Lord Privy Seal (Baroness Evans of Bowes Park) to move that the bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House.

**Lord Stevenson of Balmacara** to move, as an amendment to the above motion, at the end insert "but that this House regrets that the draft Regulations are not accompanied by a strategy or consultation on the use of state aid after the United Kingdom has left the European Union".

**European Structural and Investment Funds Common Provisions and Common Provision Rules etc. (Amendment) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019** Lord Henley to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 28 January be approved. *16th Report from the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee (Sub-Committee B)*

**Lord Stevenson of Balmacara** to move, as an amendment to the above motion, at the end insert "but that this House regrets that Her Majesty's Government has still not published plans for future post-Brexit structural or regional support arrangements for the United Kingdom, or confirmed that financial support will be at least equivalent".

**Mobile Roaming (EU Exit) Regulations 2019** Lord Ashton of Hyde to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 4 February be approved. *17th Report from the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee (Sub-Committee B)*

**Lord Stevenson of Balmacara** to move, as an amendment to the above motion, at the end insert “but that this House regrets that the draft Regulations do not, contrary to the recommendation of several consumer bodies, make provision for the maintenance of surcharge-free roaming for customers in the United Kingdom”.
