**Oral Questions, 30 minutes*

***Lord Faulkner of Worcester** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the report in the European Journal of Public Health on 25 February that there is a link between anti-establishment politics and vaccine hesitancy.

***Baroness Gardner of Parkes** to ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they will take to ensure that all providers of short-term lets are identified by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs and are paying an appropriate amount of tax.

***Lord Roberts of Llandudno** to ask Her Majesty's Government whether they will take immediate steps to tackle the issue of rough sleeping.

***Lord Fox** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the analysis by the Office for National Statistics, published on 25 March, that nearly 1.5 million jobs may be at risk of being lost to automation and that those most at risk are female workers.

Lord Howell of Guildford to move that this House takes note of the Report from the International Relations Committee *Yemen: giving peace a chance* (6th Report, HL Paper 290).
