***Viscount Ridley** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the levels of smoking and incidence of lung cancer in Sweden as a result of steps taken by that government; and what plans Ministers have to visit that country as part of their forthcoming review of tobacco harm reduction.

***Baroness Redfern** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to encourage the use of precision agriculture techniques in order to reduce carbon emissions.

***Lord Mackenzie of Framwellgate** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the entry criteria for joining police forces in England and Wales; and what plans, if any, they have to reform such criteria.

†***Lord Lee of Trafford** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the deployment of Russian troops in Venezuela.

Lord Greaves to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the progress that has been made in the registration of historic rights of way and of the benefits of extending the cut-off date for their registration. *(1 hour)*

Baroness Hodgson of Abinger to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the adequacy of international mechanisms to hold perpetrators of sexual violence to account; and what steps they are taking to ensure justice for survivors. *(1 hour)*
