**Oral Questions, 30 minutes*

***The Earl of Clancarty** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to review the visa system for non-European (1) academics and (2) musicians visiting the United Kingdom.

***Baroness Parminter** to ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to tackle the shortage of psychiatrists in the United Kingdom.

***Baroness Thornton** to ask Her Majesty's Government what impact assessment has been carried out of the effect that Babylon's GP at hand app (1) is having and (2) may have on (a) GP patient waiting lists, and (b) the funding of primary healthcare.

***Baroness Jones of Moulsecoomb** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to (1) ban or (2) restrict frequent flyer "airmiles" schemes.

Prospectus (Amendment etc.) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 Lord Bethell to move that the Regulations laid before the House on 5 September be approved. *61st Report, Session 2017–19, from the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee. Considered in Grand Committee on 16 October*
