***Lord McNicol of West Kilbride** to ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to reduce the number of children living in poverty in working households.

***Lord Ramsbotham** to ask Her Majesty's Government, further to the reply by Lord Keen of Elie on 3 June (HL Deb, col 1357), when they will announce (1) the chair, (2) the timings, and (3) the terms of reference, of the Royal Commission on criminal justice.

***Lord Paddick** to ask Her Majesty's Government what discussions they have had with the Metropolitan Police Service about the steps being taken to address racism within its ranks.

***Lord Wallace of Saltaire** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have (1) to consult relevant Parliamentary select committees about the constitutional implications of, and (2) to await the outcome of the proposed Constitution, Democracy and Rights Commission to inform, changes to (a) the machinery of Government, (b) the location of their departments and the civil service, and (c) the location of the House of Lords.

Lord Stevenson of Balmacara to move that this House regrets that the Enterprise Act 2002 (Specification of Additional Section 58 Consideration) Order 2020 and the Enterprise Act 2002 (Share of Supply Test) (Amendment) Order 2018 include permanent measures while only intended to mitigate risks against company mergers in the short term, and calls on Her Majesty's Government to subject the forthcoming National Security and Investment Bill to urgent pre-legislative scrutiny so as to ensure that it has appropriate powers to ensure that all significant mergers and acquisitions in all sectors of the economy are subject to comprehensive scrutiny by the competition authorities as regards their impact on consumers.
