\***Baroness Blackstone** to ask Her Majesty's Government, further to the announcement by the Prime Minister on 6 October that all homes will be powered through offshore wind by 2030, what plans they have to align their skills strategy with their target for net zero carbon emissions by 2050.

\***Baroness Kennedy of Cradley** to ask Her Majesty's Government what support they are providing for freelancers who work in the entertainment and music industries during the COVID-19 pandemic.
