***Lord Palmer** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to reduce food waste.

***Lord Austin of Dudley** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the statements by Professor David Miller about Jewish students; and what discussions they have had with (1) the University of Bristol, and (2) the police, about the steps being taken to ensure the safety of such students.

***Lord Dubs** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assistance they are providing to Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe in preparation for the end of her sentence in March.

***The Lord Bishop of Newcastle** to ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the report by the Care Quality Commission *Protect, respect, connect—decisions about living and dying well during COVID-19*, published on 18 March, on decisions about the use of 'do not attempt cardiopulmonary resuscitation' orders for (1) care home residents, and (2) people with learning disabilities, during the pandemic.

†**Lord Herbert of South Downs** to ask Her Majesty's Government, further to the announcement by the World Health Organisation on 22 March that an estimated 1.4 million fewer people received necessary care for Tuberculosis in 2020 compared with 2019, what they are doing to tackle Tuberculosis globally.
