***Lord Brooke of Alverthorpe** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to review the objectives of the National Lottery.

***Lord McConnell of Glenscorrodale** to ask Her Majesty's Government what outcomes they expect from the Global Education Summit being co-hosted by the United Kingdom and Kenya on 28 and 29 July.

***Baroness Gale** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to investigate the nature of domestic abuse of older people; and what support they offer to victims of such abuse.

***Lord Dodds of Duncairn** to ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to address the concerns expressed by the Jewish community in Northern Ireland about its future as a result of the operation of the Protocol on Ireland/Northern Ireland.

†**Lord Fowler** to ask Her Majesty's Government, further to the Written Statement by the Chancellor of the Exchequer on 12 July (HCWS172) setting out the fiscal circumstances under which they will return to spending 0.7 per cent of Gross National Income on Overseas Development Assistance, as stipulated in the Official Development Assistance Target Act 2015, whether they intend to bring forward primary legislation in this area; and if not, why not.

Railway (Licensing of Railway Undertakings) (Amendment) Regulations 2021 Baroness Vere of Norbiton to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 21 June be approved. *8th Report from the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee. Considered in Grand Committee on 12 July*

Motor Fuel (Composition and Content) and the Biofuel (Labelling) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2021 Baroness Vere of Norbiton to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 21 June be approved. *Special attention drawn to the instrument by the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee, 8th Report. Considered in Grand Committee on 12 July*

Business and Planning Act 2020 (Pavement Licences) (Coronavirus) (Amendment) Regulations 2021 Lord Greenhalgh to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 8 June be approved. *6th Report from the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee. Considered in Grand Committee on 8 July*
