Oral questions (40 minutes)

***Lord Lexden** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to ensure the preservation of England's historic counties.

***Lord Kennedy of Southwark** to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to ensure leaseholders do not bear the costs of repairing building and fire safety defects for which they are not responsible. [I]

***Baroness Wilcox of Newport** to ask Her Majesty's Government what protocol they follow for working constructively with the devolved administrations.

***Lord Robathan** to ask Her Majesty's Government what military equipment provided by the United Kingdom to Afghanistan is now in the hands of the Taliban; and what estimate they have made of the number of soldiers fighting for the Taliban who were trained by British instructors.

Questions to the Minister of State at the Cabinet Office (Lord Frost) (30 minutes)

***The Earl of Kinnoull** to ask the Minister of State at the Cabinet Office (Lord Frost) what steps Her Majesty's Government are taking to prepare businesses for the introduction of new checks and controls on imports into Great Britain from the European Union on 1 October 2021 and 1 January 2022.

***Lord Foulkes of Cumnock** to ask the Minister of State at the Cabinet Office (Lord Frost) what plans Her Majesty's Government have to extend further the grace period on imports from the European Union to the United Kingdom.

***Baroness Hoey** to ask the Minister of State at the Cabinet Office (Lord Frost) what assessment Her Majesty's Government have made of the operation of the Protocol on Ireland/Northern Ireland on power sharing in Northern Ireland and the Belfast/Good Friday Agreement.

†**Business of the House** The Lord Privy Seal (Baroness Evans of Bowes Park) to move that Standing Order 44 (*No two stages of a Bill to be taken on one day*) be dispensed with on Monday 11 October to allow the Health and Social Care Levy Bill to be taken through its remaining stages that day.

Baroness Blackstone to move that this House takes note of the role of behaviour change in helping the United Kingdom to reach net zero carbon emissions by 2050, as set out in the report by the Climate Change Committee *Reducing emissions: 2021 Progress Report to Parliament*, published on 26 June; and of the case for a public engagement strategy to facilitate this (*Balloted debate, 2½ hours*)

Baroness Greengross to ask Her Majesty's Government what plans they have to address the intergenerational impact of proposed changes to social care funding. (*Topical Question for Short Debate, 1 hour*)

Lord Norton of Louth to move that this House takes note of the case for enhancing the quality of government through the introduction of training in core leadership skills for (1) ministers, and (2) senior civil servants. (*Balloted debate, 2½ hours*)

Safeguarding (Code of Practice) Measure The Lord Bishop of Blackburn to move that this House do direct that, in accordance with the Church of England Assembly (Powers) Act 1919, the Safeguarding (Code of Practice) Measure be presented to Her Majesty for the Royal Assent.

Lord Agnew of Oulton intends to move the following two motions en bloc: but if any Lord objects the motions must be moved separately.

Capital Requirements Regulation (Amendment) Regulations 2021 Lord Agnew of Oulton to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 12 July be approved. *Considered in Grand Committee on 14 September*

Merchant Shipping (Prevention of Air Pollution from Ships) (Amendment) Regulations 2021 Baroness Vere of Norbiton to move that the draft Regulations laid before the House on 6 July be approved. *Considered in Grand Committee on 14 September*
