***Baroness Anelay of St Johns** to ask Her Majesty’s Government, further to the speech from the Secretary of State for the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office on 8 December at Chatham House on *Building the Network of Liberty*, what plans they have to support the International Day of Democracy.

***Baroness Jones of Whitchurch** to ask Her Majesty’s Government whether they are considering an emergency application for the use of neonicotinoids on sugar beet; and if so, what consideration they will give to the advice of (1) the Health and Safety Executive, and (2) the Expert Committee on Pesticides.
