**11 UK Infrastructure Bank Bill [HL]** Baroness Penn made a statement on Legislative Consent. Then the bill was read a third time. A privilege amendment was agreed to. Then, after debate, the bill was passed and sent to the Commons.

**12 Australia Free Trade Agreement** Baroness Hayter of Kentish Town moved that this House takes note of the Australia Free Trade Agreement, laid before the House on 15 June. After debate, the motion was agreed to.

**13 M56 Motorway (Junctions 6 to 7) (Variable Speed Limits) Regulations 2022** Baroness Randerson moved that this House regrets that the M56 Motorway (Junctions 6 to 7) (Variable Speed Limits) Regulations 2022 do not sufficiently take into account recent evidence about the risks of smart motorways and the use of the hard shoulder as a running lane, nor the concerns raised by the House of Commons Transport Committee, which recommended the pause of the rollout of future All Lane Running smart motorway schemes until a full five years' worth of safety data is available (SI 2022/607). After debate, the motion was withdrawn.

**14 Child vulnerability (Public Services Committee Report)** Baroness Armstrong of Hill Top moved that this House takes note of the Report from the Public Services Committee *Children in crisis: the role of public services in overcoming child vulnerability* (1st Report, Session 2021–22, HL Paper 95). After debate, the motion was agreed to.
