Oral questions (40 minutes)

***Baroness Wilcox of Newport** to ask His Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the impact, if any, of the HS2 rail project in Wales.

***Baroness Bryan of Partick** to ask His Majesty's Government what meetings have been held in 2022 with the devolved administrations as part of the intergovernmental relations arrangements.

***Baroness Wheeler** to ask His Majesty's Government what plans they have to announce new measures to ensure that carers are consulted and involved in hospital decisions to discharge patients under the Discharge to Assess policy.

†***Baroness Merron** to ask His Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the report by the British Heart Foundation *Tipping Point*, published on 3 November; and what steps they intend to take in response to the finding that from the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic to August 2022 there were 30,000 excess deaths involving coronary heart disease in England.

†**Higher Education (Freedom of Speech) Bill** The Lord Privy Seal (Lord True) to move that the bill be reported from the Grand Committee in respect of proceedings up to and including Wednesday 2 November; that the order of commitment of 28 June be discharged and the remainder of the bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House; and that the instruction to the Grand Committee of 28 June shall also be an instruction to the Committee of the Whole House.
