Oral questions (40 minutes)

***Lord Strasburger** to ask His Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to protect freedom of expression in the course of their work on combating disinformation.

***Baroness Bennett of Manor Castle** to ask His Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of reports that a global oversupply of petrochemicals has led to recycled plastics failing to compete with new, and whether they plan to take any action in response.

***Lord Watson of Invergowrie** to ask His Majesty's Government what plans they have to empower Ofsted to review pupil absence rates as part of their school inspections.

***Baroness Owen of Alderley Edge** to ask His Majesty's Government whether they plan to prohibit 'nudify' apps which create intimate images of other people using artificial intelligence without their consent.

Four questions to the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs (40 minutes).

Lord Collins of Highbury to ask the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs what recent discussions he has had with international counterparts on a strategy to reduce debt in the developing world.

Baroness Bennett of Manor Castle to ask the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs what his Department is doing to ensure the lives and security of the children of Gaza.

Lord Walney to ask the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs what progress His Majesty's Government has made in implementing the AUKUS security partnership between the United Kingdom, Australia and the United States of America.

Lord Jackson of Peterborough to ask the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs what discussions he had with the government of the United States before his announcement on 1 February that the United Kingdom should recognise a Palestinian state in advance of the conclusion of any future bilateral talks between Israel and representatives of the Palestinian people.
